

## **HARRISON TOWNSHIP TRUSTEE MEETING**

**February 17, 2026**

### **REGULAR MEETING CALL TO ORDER:**

Chairman Donnie Mayse called the Regular Trustee Meeting of February 17, 2026, to order with the Pledge of Allegiance at 5:00pm at the Harrison Township Fire Department, 3625 State Route 752, Ashville, Ohio 43103. Present were Trustee Donnie Mayse, Trustee Bill Welsh, Trustee Chad Noggle, Roads and Zoning Operations Manager Austin Cline, Fire Chief Shawn Davidson, Assistant Chief Colt Cline, Township Clerk Sara LeMaster and Cemetery Operations Manager Jared Conner. Absent was Fiscal Officer Lindsay Mayse. Visitors present were PIO Steve Sabine, Brian Hill from P3, Jim Deal, Ronde Brushart, Todd Younkin, Trevor Younkin, Tammy Seymour and firefighters Brian Kirkpatrick, Rusty Smith, and Jeremy Lust.

### **HEARING OF VISITORS:**

1. Brian Hill was present to request appointment to the JEDD board.
2. Todd Younkin was present, representing the Younkin family, seeking additional information on the CEDA vs. North Gate Alliance and revenue-sharing.
3. Ronde Brushart was present to express appreciation to the trustees for preserving the township and to advocate for the signing of the new CEDA agreement.
4. All other visitors were present to observe.

### **ZONING:**

#### **RESOLUTION 26-17**

#### **A RESOLUTION TO IMPOSE A TEMPORARY SIX-MONTH MORATORIUM ON DATA CENTER USE APPLICATIONS, SOUTH OF 762, WITH THE OPTION TO EXTEND THE MORATORIUM.**

Mr. Mayse moved, Mr. Welsh seconded, and the Trustees voted as follows: Mr. Mayse, yes; Mr. Welsh, yes; Mr. Noggle, no.

### **ROADS:**

#### **RESOLUTION 26-18**

#### **A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE HARRISON TOWNSHIP'S PARTICIPATION IN THE 2026 COUNTYWIDE PAVING PROJECT FOR REPAIRS ON WEIGAND ROAD, EAST OF BULEN PIERCE TO THE PAVEMENT BREAK AT THE QUARRY, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$103,577.**

Mr. Mayse moved, Mr. Welsh seconded, and the Trustees voted with three affirmative votes to approve R26-18.

#### **RESOLUTION 26-19**

#### **A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE HARRISON TOWNSHIP'S PARTICIPATION IN THE 2026 COUNTYWIDE PAVING PROJECT FOR REPAIRS ON LOCKBOURNE EASTERN ROAD, FROM THE PAVEMENT BREAK NEAR THE BALL FIELDS, TO ST. PAUL ROAD, IN THE AMOUNT OF \$96,330.**

Mr. Mayse moved, Mr. Welsh seconded, and the Trustees voted with three affirmative votes to approve R26-19.

#### **RESOLUTION 26-20**

#### **A RESOLUTION TO CONTRACT WITH ROESE BROS. PAVING FOR THE BULEN PIERCE (SR 762 TO SHEPHERD ROAD) PROJECT, FOR \$22,718.**

Mr. Mayse moved, Mr. Welsh seconded, and the Trustees voted with three affirmative votes to approve R26-20.

**CEMETERY:** None.

### **FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

1. Chief Davidson shared that Colin Osterman broke his foot (off duty) and will be off work for a while.

2. Chief Davidson shared that the county is moving to a new CAD system, but he is unsure of the cost at this time.
3. Chief Davidson and the Trustees discussed the need for a second fire station. The Trustees advised Chief Davidson to look into getting quotes for a township-owned fire station, on property already owned by the township in South Bloomfield.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS:**

#### **RESOLUTION 26-21**

**A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE THE SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION OF \$40,000 FROM THE FIRE FUND TO FIRE BWC.** Mr. Mayse moved, Mr. Welsh seconded, and the Trustees voted with three affirmative votes to approve R26-21.

#### **RESOLUTION 26-22**

**A RESOLUTION TO APPROVE AND PAY THE ATTACHED LIST OF BILLS AS THE LAWFUL OBLIGATIONS OF HARRISON TOWNSHIP.** Mr. Mayse moved, Mr. Welsh seconded, and the Trustees voted with three affirmative votes to approve R26-22.
